

Supreme Court collegium headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud on Thursday recommended the names of seven additional judges of the Allahabad High Court and 11 of the Punjab and Haryana High Court for appointment as permanent judges.

The collegium, also comprising Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul and Sanjiv Khanna, met today and its decision was uploaded on the apex court website.

Those who have been recommended for appointment

are Justices Umesh Chandra Sharma, Renu Agarwal, Ram Manohar Narayan Mishra, Mayank Kumar Jain, Shiv Shanker Prasad. Gajendra Kumar and Nalin Kumar Srivastava of the Allahabad High Court.

As per the SC collegium's resolution, on May 1, 2023, the collegium of the Allahabad High Court unanimously made the recommendations and the chief minister and governor of Uttar Pradesh have concurred with

terms of the Memorandum of Procedure, the judges of the Supreme with the affairs of the High Court of Judicature at Allahabad were consulted with a view to ascertain the suitability of the Additional Judges for being appointed as permanent judges.
