He also laid stress upon expediting ongoing tourism projects in Jammu, particthe Artificial Lake/Taw Barrage project. He said the government has done a great job in promoting Kahsmir and the need of the hour is to take adequate action to boost tourism in Jammu. He suggested the government make a tourism circuit by connecting all the places having the potential to boost tourism and hold the tourists in the Jammu He reiterated the poten-

tial to boost tourism in the region, which could have far-reaching economic ben-

Lastly, Gupta expressed concern over the proposed hike in power tariffs for industrial units in the region. He requested the Chief Secretary to hold and review this move, emphasizing the importance of supporting the industrial sector's growth and competitiveness as the industrial sector of the Jammu region is in struggling

The Chief Secretary gave a patient hearing to the issues put forth by the former General Secretary of the Chamber and assured to take necessary steps in redressing the same.
