

HC quashed PSA of Mohan Cheer

JAMMU: Justice Sanjay Dhar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court today quashed the detention under PSA of Rajesh Dogra @ Mohan Cheer, a gangster.

Justice Sanjay Dhar after hearing Adv Assem Sawhney for the petitioner; observed that after perusal of the record shows that the contention of the petitioner is well founded. The earlier detention order dated 29.11.2021 (supra) was based upon the grounds of detention that was bearing reference to FIR No. 77/1993 of Police Station, Pacea Danga, FIR No. 201/1996 of Police Station, Pacea Danga, FIR No. 56/1998 of Police Station, Jammu City, FIR No. 147/1998 of Police Station, Udhampur; FIR No. 89/2006 of Police Station Gangyal, Jammu, FIR No. 140/2006 of Police Station, Bahu Fort, and FIR No. 79/2020 of Police

Station, Gharota, Jammu. The said detention order, as already noted, has been quashed by this Court in terms of judgment dated 01.04.2022 passed in writ petition WP(CrI) No. 74/2021. Without making any reference to the said judgment or even to the fact that the earlier detention of the petitioner had been quashed, the grounds of detention have been formulated by the District Magistrate that has become the basis of passing of the impugned order of detention.

Court further observed that either the fact relating to quashment of the earlier detention order was not brought to the notice of the District Magistrate or the District Magistrate has conveniently ignored to take note of the said fact. In either eventuality, it reflects non application of mind on the part of the Detaining Authority as it is quite possible that if the fact relating to quashment of earlier detention order would have come to the notice of the said Authority, and

the same would have been considered by the Detaining Authority, the impugned order may not have been passed.

On this ground also, the impugned order of detention becomes unsustainable in law. With these observations High Court allowed the petition and the impugned order of detention is quashed. The detenu/petitioner is directed to be released from the preventive custody forthwith provided he is not required in connection with any other case.

HC upholds detention of narcotics smuggler

JAMMU: Justice Sanjay Dhar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court today Upheld the detention under PSA of Mustaq Khan alias Lucky a Narcotics Smugglers.

Justice Sanjay Dhar while dismissing the petition, observed that petitioner has placed on record a copy of the dossier, which does not bear reference to FIR No. 58/2023, but according to the respondents, it is the

dossier on the basis of which, the impugned order of detention has been formulated that has been supplied to the petitioner. This particular dossier bears reference to both the FIRs and enclosed therewith is the material relating to both the FIRs.

The execution report bears signatures of the petitioner and the Detaining Authority has sworn an affidavit wherein it is stated that whole of the material

has been supplied to the detenu. Therefore, the version of the respondents has to be accepted. Thus, it cannot be stated that the petitioner has not been provided the entire material forming basis of grounds of detention.

It has been contended that the fact the petitioner has been granted bail in both the FIRs, reference whereof is given in the grounds of detention, does find a mention in the said grounds and

this exhibits lack of application of mind on the part of the Detaining Authority.

Court further observed that it is correct that the fact regarding grant of bail to the petitioner does not find mention in the grounds of detention but if we have a look at the grounds of detention and the record of detention that was placed before the Detaining Authority, it becomes crystal clear that the said authority was alive to the

fact that the detenu was on bail and despite this the Detaining Authority has passed the impugned order of detention.

In fact the Detaining Authority has in its counter affidavit specifically pleaded that it was having the knowledge about grant of bail to the detenu in both the cases. Thus, it cannot be stated that there was lack of application of mind on the part of the Detaining Authority.

CS reviews developmental scenario of Samba Dist

SAMBHA: Chief Secretary, Dr. Arun Kumar Mehta, conducted a comprehensive review of ongoing developmental projects and flagship initiatives spanning various sectors in district Samba on Friday. The primary focus of the meeting was to assess the progress of various schemes and development projects currently underway in the district. The meeting was attended by Divisional Commissioner Jammu Ramesh Kumar, SSP Samba Benam Tosh, along with the heads of various divisions and departments operating within the district.

During the meeting, the Deputy Commissioner Samba Abhishek Sharma presented a detailed sector-wise overview of the ongoing projects and flagship schemes being managed by various departments in the district. Notable projects, including the construction of the Bus Stand under JMRDA at Vijaypur, the Degree College at Purmandal, and the Nari Niketan building in Samba, were highlighted. Updates on the upgradation of the existing Municipal complex, the construction of a multifunctional complex at Samba bus stand, the construction of Uttarbelni bridge over Dewar, several road projects, and the construction of the OPD block of District Hospital Samba, were also provided.

Chief Secretary also reviewed the status of ongoing projects, programs, flagship schemes, and financial progress for the fiscal years 2022-23 and 2023-24. A wide array of departments including Horticulture, National Rural Livelihood Mission, National Urban Livelihood Mission, Agriculture, Education, Health, Social Welfare, Animal Husbandry, Jal Shakti, JPDCL, SBM-G, Jal Jeevan Mission, PMGSY, PWD, and languishing projects were discussed in detail.

During the review, it was emphasized on to expedite the works as a top priority. Heads of various departments also provided updates on the current status of their respective schemes. Several directives were issued during the meeting, including a strong focus on achieving zero unemployment in the district by the Labour and Employment department.

The Education department was tasked with ensuring an adequate number of teachers in each panchayat and 100% functional female toilet facilities in schools.

The Animal and Sheep husbandry department was directed to concentrate on export-based production of poultry and milk products and formulate one PACS per panchayat. The Agriculture department was instructed to increase crop intensity, conduct workshops in collaboration with SKUAST, and prioritize the production of fruits

such as dragon fruit, strawberry, and citrus fruits. The goal is to make the J&K the leader in horticulture production by identifying and eliminating gaps in performance compared to other states.

The review also encompassed the Nasha Mukta Abhyaan (drug-free campaign), with a directive to ensure a drug-free Samba district. Dr Mehta commended the work of the revenue department for their work in geo-referencing cadastral maps, digitizing Jamabandis, and addressing the status of Roshni land. The chief secretary stressed the importance of making land girdawari available online.

In the domains of PMGSY and PWD, authorities were urged to expedite work and meet assigned targets on time. The progress of the Jal Jeevan Mission was reviewed with an emphasis on accelerating its completion.

While reviewing the Jal Shakti Department, Chief Secretary asked the department to complete all works within stipulated timelines without exception.

While reviewing the RDD it was said that independent reports must be sought regarding the SBM(G) from the village to verify that the villages are really clean. He called for the removal of all legacy wastes from gram panchayats. He directed that all villages should be made plastic-free and achieve

PMAY(G) targets within set timelines.

Regarding NRLM, Chief Secretary called for improving the average income of Self-Help Group (SHG) members by providing them the necessary handholding in terms of marketing, branding and value addition of their products.

While taking the review of Industries and Commerce department, Chief Secretary took note of the non-functional industrial units and impressed upon the district administration to look into the possible reasons so that these are made functional forthwith. He observed that the district has a great potential in terms of industrial development and if its potential is tapped optimally Samba is poised to be the developed industrial district of the UT.

As part of this comprehensive review, Dr. Mehta also e-inaugurated several projects, including the material recovery facility & compost pit shed in the Municipal Committee Bari-Brahmana, the improvement of WSS BHALOORA under JJM in Block Rajpura and the improvement of WSS Rai Patti under JJM in Block Ghagwal.

Chief Secretary underscored the importance of identifying additional services that can be transitioned to online mode to streamline government processes and ensure citizens are not unduly inconvenienced by visiting government offices.

Dr. Mehta also held discussions with DDC Chairperson Keshav Dutt Sharma and members, BDC members and business delegations. He listened to them patiently and directed the District Administration to hold regular interactions with them for the overall development of the district and percolation of benefits of all the beneficiary oriented schemes down to grassroots level.

Only Congress listening to people's sufferings, BJP turns deaf ear: Bhalla

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir Pradesh Congress Committee (JKPCC) Working President Raman Bhalla, expressed his views and the position of the Congress Party on various issues, especially in the context of the BJP-led government in India and its policies in Jammu and Kashmir.

Prominent personalities and their supporters from Sainik Colony have extended their support to the Congress Party for upcoming elections.

Bhalla criticized the BJP, claiming that it has made the lives of various sections of society miserable. He asserted that the Congress is the party that listens to the problems of the people.

He emphasized the importance of voting and warned against neglecting the duty to vote, suggesting that not casting a vote indirectly benefits the BJP.

Bhalla highlighted Congress's commitment to the welfare and protection of the rights of labour-class people in the coun-

try. He mentioned landmark legislation brought by the UPA government for the benefit of labourers.

Bhalla asserted that the Government of India has failed to address the legitimate aspirations of the people of Jammu and Kashmir, and he criticized the BJP's policies in the region.

He expressed concerns about the democratic aspects of the BJP's rule in Jammu and Kashmir, claiming that it is not in line with the idea of "Naya Kashmir" propounded by the Congress government.

He also emphasized the party's commitment to addressing the concerns of various sections of society, especially the labour class.
