Search operation extended to neutralise terrorist in Reasi

REASI: Security forces on Tuesday extended the search operation to adjoining vilages to track down a terrorist who managed to escape from a remote village in Reasi district, officials said.

While one terrorist was killed and two security personnel injured in the initial gunfight at Gali Sohab village in Tuli area on Monday, the second terrorist slipped out from the cordoned house located on a slope, taking advantage of rough terrain, the

They said the security forces stormed the house early this morning amid intense firing but there was no trace of the second terrorist who was believed hiding inside. However, the search parties comprising police, Army and CRPF retrieved the body of the slain terrorist and also recovered an AK assault rifle, two magazines, a ruck-

The officials said reinforcements were rushed to the area and nearly half-a-dozen adjoining villages in the forested area were sealed and a search operation is undervay to neutralize the fleeing terrorist. Jammu-based defence PRO Lt Col Suneel Bartwal said the Army along with

The defence PRO said the terrorists trapped inside the cordoned house opened fire on the security personnel deployed outside and in the ensuing heavy gunfight, one

terrorist was neutralized. "A detailed search of the house and the surrounding areas after the encounter resulted in the recovery of one terrorist's body along with other warlike stores.

Search operation is in progress," Lt Col Bartwal said. He said the Army successfully demolished an improvised explosive device (IED) in

the same region on September 3. "A major incident has been averted in the region by these two consecutive actions by security forces. The presence of these heavily armed terrorists in the hinterland

indicates sustained attempts by inimical forces to destabilize the South of Pir Panjal Region," the defence PRO said. in the village broke out around 2 nm on Monday The officials said the encounter when the joint troops zeroed in on the house where the terrorists had taken shelter

at gunpoint during the intervening night of Sunday and Monday. After getting information about the presence of the terrorists, security forces after trekking for over four hours reached the village and cornered the terrorists who opened indiscriminate firing in a vain bid to escape the security dragnet, the offi-

The officials said the slain terrorist is believed to be a part of banned Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) module operating in Rajouri, Poonch and Reasi districts. Two members of the same group were eliminated in Khawas area of Rajouri on August 5.

While the body of one terrorist was recovered from the scene of the encounter the same day, another body of a terrorist who had jumped into a river was retrieved from a village in Reasi district on August 18.

The border district of Poonch along with nearby Rajouri has witnessed several encounters this year, resulting in the killing of around 20 terrorists and 10 security

Most of the terrorists were killed while attempting to sneak into this side from across the border, the officials said.

During the search operation, the police recovered two blankets, some edibles and personal use items from the hideout, indicating the presence of the terrorist, the officer said, adding the recovery of these items underscores the importance of this operation in disrupting unlawful activities in the region.

The SSP said the entire area has been cordoned and searches are being conducted. "Our mission is to ensure the safety and security of our citizens, and today's operation is a resounding success in our ongoing efforts to eradicate terrorism from the region," Poswal said.

The officer urged the citizens to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activities or come forward with information that could aid in maintaining peace and thwarting the designs of anti-social elements.

20 years RI awarded to 2 narco smugglers STATĚ TIMES NEWS

SRINAGAR: In a groundbreaking verdict today, the Court of Additional Sessions Judge issued a landmark judgment against two individuals involved in a narcotics smuggling case, sentencing them to 20 years of rigorous imprisonment, along with a Rs 2.0 lakh fine for each of the two accused.

The convicted individuals, Syed Ishfaq Shah, son of Ghulam Mohiuddin Shah, and Khursheed Ahmad Gojar, son of Nawab ud din Gojar, both residents of Jabdi Karnah, were arrested in connection with FIR No.56/2019 at Police Station Karnah. Their arrest followed the discovery of 15 kilograms of brown sugar obtained from both accused individuals during their confession in the Karnah area Further investigation conclusively established that the duo intended to transport

the narcotics consignment from Karnah to Punjab. Additionally, it was proven that both smugglers had procured the narcotics consignment from across the Line of Control (LOC) through Bashir Ahmad, who is presently settled in Pakistan-occu pied Jammu and Kashmir (POJK) and is known to be a cousin of Khursheed

Inspector Wasim Ahmad Badoo, the then SHO of Police Station Karnah, led the thorough investigation of this case. The legal battle was effectively fought by Assistant Public Prosecutor (APP) Dar Rashid on behalf of the State of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir. The case was expedited and heard on a fast track basis, with the Pairvi cells, established under the guidance of the Police Headquarters, ensuring the timely presence of witnesses and their testimonies.

This significant judgment underscores the unwavering commitment of the crimi nal justice system to combat narcotics smuggling and uphold the law. The exemplary teamwork exhibited by the investigative agencies and the legal counsel played ε crucial role in bringing these narcotics smugglers to justice.

Fake job racket busted in Kupwara, 5 held ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

SRINAGAR: Police on Tuesday arrested five persons who were running a fake job racket in Kupwara district, officials said here.

Acting on a complaint, police arrested Nazir Ahmad Khan who had duped a youth of Rs 70,000 by promising to provide him with a job in the Military Engineering Service (MES).

"Responding swiftly to the complaint and supported by credible intelligence from the Military Intelligence (MI), the Kralpora Police Station initiated legal proceedings by registering an FIR," the officials said. During the investigations, key witnesses were examined and counterfeit appoint

ment letters were seized as evidence. "Khan was subsequently apprehended in connection with the scam. The accused disclosed his affiliation with a group of scammers employing a distinctive modus

operandi to defraud unemployed youths eagerly seeking positions within MES, the official said. "Khan revealed the identities of his four accomplices, Zahoor Ahmad Min Shakeel Ahmad Makroo, Feroz Ahmad Khashu and Shafkat Ahmad Shah, who

were also arrested," they said. Makroo, who emerged as the mastermind of the scam, operated under the alias 'Raju," presenting himself as an MES officer stationed at Rangreth, Srinagar they said.

He enlisted the assistance of Mir, Khashu, and Khan as field agents, entrusted with the task of extracting money from unsuspecting job seekers, the officials

They said Shah, the "technical expert" of the racket, was responsible for fabri cating and printing counterfeit appointment letters and other documentation

they said. "As of now, the gang has duped eight unemployed youths hailing from North Kashmir, amassing an illicit sum of Rs 25 lakhs," the officials said, adding that more arrests were expected as the investigations in the case were ongoing.
