An attempt should be made to

stop the bleeding by pressing the pressure point. Red Cross Field Officer Veronica formed the Red Cross unit in the campus. During the camp, students were also given information about first aid and assistance to be given to an accident victim in case of head

She emphasized that head injury is the biggest cause of death in road accidents. In such a situation, if the injured person gets proper treatment on time, the chances of saving his life increases.
