Ram Swaroop, Executive Director, Regional Office, Jammu said that this is an important achievement of NHPC. "This is the result of our

hard work of the last 49 years since inception of NHPC in 1975. Getting the status of "Navratna" has infused a new energy in us and we will contribute to the development of the company with even more dedication and enthusiasm," Ram Swaroop said.

He further added in his speech that NHPC has total installed capacity is 7144.20 MW and the company is presently engaged in the construction of projects aggregating to 10442.70 MW. These include the 2000 MW Subansiri Lower proj-

ect (Assam/ Arunachal Pradesh) and 2880 MW Dibang Multi-purpose project (Arunachal Pradesh). Besides, NHPC is working on development of more than 50000 MW capacity projects which are under various stages. NHPC is also steadfastly working towards achieving an installed capacity of 23000 MW by 2032 and 50000 MW by 2047.

NC-Congress alliance is a gimmick to regain power: Abhijeet Jasrotia

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir BJP Spokesperson Abhijeet Jasrotia on Saturday launched a blistering critique of National Conference (NC) Vice President Omar Abdullah in response to Abdullah's remarks questioning the credibility of BJP leader Tarun Chug.

Jasrotia reminded Abdullah that the BJP, the party he now criticizes, had once trained him as a Union Minister, underscoring the BJP's seniority and credibility in national politics. Jasrotia challenged Abdullah to account for the NC's alleged role in the state's turmoil, including the deaths of 1.5 lakh people during violent years while Abdullah was reportedly vacationing in London.

He accused the NC of betraying the people of Jammu and Kashmir and criticized Abdullah for his attempts to present himself

as a reformer. Highlighting the dynastic nature of NC and Congress alliances, Jasrotia referred to historical pacts such as the Sheikh Abdullah-Jawahar Lal Nehru alliance, the Indira-Sheikh alliance, the Farooq Abdullah-Rajiv Gandhi alliance, and the current Rahul Gandhi-Omar Abdullah alliance.

He claimed these agreements had destabilized Jammu and Kashmir and exacerbated conflict.

Jasrotia dismissed Abdullah's recent comments about being in alliance with Congress "under compulsion" as merely an extension of dynastic politics that hampered the region.

The BJP spokesperson also addressed NC's push for greater autonomy and the pre-1953 status, which he said had been rejected by previous central governments and the people of Jammu and Kashmir.

He accused the NC of

neglecting marginalized communities like Gujjars and Bakewals and warned against the rollback of rights restored by the BJP, including those for women and refugee communities.

Jasrotia further criticized Abdullah and Rahul Gandhi for opposing the current peace and development in J&K, pointing to increased tourism as a sign of stability. He condemned the latest NC-Congress accord as a power grab and warned against potential measures like reinstating visa requirements for travel to J&K, which the BJP would oppose.

The press briefing was attended by BJP Media Incharge Dr. Pardeep Mahotra, Lt. Gen. Rakesh Sharma (Retd.), Y.V. Sharma, and Ritika Trehan, who supported Jasrotia's assertions and underscored the BJP's commitment to ensuring peace, development, and stability in the region.

Rally held demanding early release of Saint Asharamji Bapu

JAMMU: Rallies and demonstrations took place across various cities in India, marking the completion of 11 years since Saint Asharamji Bapu's arrest.

Organised by Shri Yoga Vedanta Seva Samiti in Jammu, the rally called for the immediate release of Bapuji, who is currently serving a life sentence. The participants, including numerous men and women, expressed their discontent with what they describe as an unjust legal process. Saint Asharamji Bapu, an 82-year-old spiritual leader, was sentenced to life imprisonment amid claims of a conspiracy, ongoing media trials,

and misuse of anti-rape laws. His supporters argue that despite his declining health, Bapuji remains incarcerated due to what they see as fabricated charges.

The rally began at the Jammu Ashram and proceeded through Canal Road, ending at Jewel. During the protest, participants submitted memorandums to the District Magistrate, which were then forwarded to the President, Prime Minister, Union Home Minister, Law Minister, and the National Human Rights Commission.

In his address, the media in-charge of the protest, condemned the alleged tar-
