Subject: - General Elections to Legislative Assembly, 2024 (J&K)- Voting by Postal Ballot for Voters on Election Duty/AVES at Facilitation Centre/PVC.

**NOTICE**

Whereas, Section 60 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 specifies the special procedure for voting by Postal Ballot by certain classes of persons, among which are Voters on Election Duty and Absentee voters.

Whereas, as per Rule 17, Voter on Election Duty means any polling agent, any polling officer, presiding officer or other public servant, who is an elector in the constituency and is by reason of his being on election duty unable to vote at the polling station where he is entitled to vote and includes all polling officials, all police personnel deployed on election duty, all the Commission's Observers and the staff members accompanying them. Further the Commission has also extended this facility of Postal Ballot to all Private Persons and Non-Government Staff engaged in Election work, such as drivers, conductors, cleaners of vehicles, videographers, staff of expenditure monitoring teams, staff working in control room, helpline staff, those appointed for dispatch and receiving of poll material, EVM maintenance, etc.

Whereas, the Commission has directed that the polling parties and associated civilian staff accompanying the polling parties shall vote at a facilitation centre to be setup by the Returning Officer. In addition to this facilitation centre, the Commission has further directed that the Returning Officer will setup an additional facilitation centre at his office as well, for the Voters on Election Duty other than the those in polling parties and the those accompanying the polling parties and includes the police personnel, drivers, conductors, cleaners of vehicles, videographers, staff of expenditure monitoring teams, staff working in control room, helpline staff, those appointed for dispatch and receiving of poll material, EVM maintenance, etc.

Whereas, the Commission has further directed the Returning Officer to identify the suitable venue and room at a suitable location to be used as Postal Voting Centre (PVC) for issuing Postal Ballot Papers to the Absentee voters in the category of Essential Service (AVES), who would be on duty on the day of poll and on account of their such official duties, will not be able to cast their vote at their respective polling stations.

In view of the above provisions, the following locations are hereby designated as Facilitation Centre/Postal Voting Centre (PVC) for voting by Postal Ballots in respect of AC 52-Doda as per the details below:-

As a pre-requisite, the said documents of the candidates were checked and verified on 9<sup>th</sup> of September, 2024 by the Committee constituted for the purpose. After the verification of documents submitted by the candidates it has been found that all the candidates mentioned in Annexure-A to this Notification who have applied under Hindu Minority Quota are eligible for consideration under the said Category.

While the candidates who have applied under NRI category as mentioned in (Annexure-B) to this Notification, it has been found that documents of only Twenty-five (25) candidates out of the total of Thirty-six (36) are complete in all respects, whereas documents of Eleven (11) candidates have been found deficient as mentioned against each in the (Annexure-B) to this Notification. The candidates in their own interest are advised to clear the deficiencies as shown against their names, by or before 11-09-2024 (till 01:00 p.m.).

The counseling for Management Quota of Hindu Minority (HM) and NRI Quota Seats shall be held during the Second Round of Physical Counselling as and when notified by the Board.
