SVEEP drive heightens voter engagement across district Kishtwar

She criticized the previous governments, stating that the National Conference (NC) and Congress engage in separatist and dynastic politics. She mentioned that before Article 370 was abrogated, such gatherings or rallies were not possible, but now, after the removal of Article 370 by BJP, they are. She claimed that the NC and Congress want to reinstate Article 370 and have allowed atrocities against Hindus, provided shelter to terrorism, and misled the people. The public is now aware and enthusiastic about the country's interest, she said. She asserted that if BJP forms the government this time, all the promises made by BJP will be fulfilled, and a double-engine government will be established in Jammu. She also highlighted BJP's welfare schemes, stating that under Prime Minister Modi's leadership, 25 crore poor families have been lifted out of poverty, and there has been a

significant improvement in living standards. Additionally, under the PM Awas Yojana, over 3 crore families across the country have been provided with permanent housing. Court issues warrants against MD Jayashree Advertising

JAMMU: District Judge Commercial Court Jammu Kamlesh Pandita today issued bailable warrants of Rs 25000 of Managing Director Jayashree Advertising Pvt. Ltd. This order has been passed by District Judge Commercial Court Jammu Kamlesh Pandita after hearing Advocate Inderjeet Gupta with Adv Yatini Mahajan for the Airport Authority of India in execution petition. Court after hearing Advocates Inderjeet Gupta and Yatini Mahajan observed that In this exe-

cution petition decree holder is craving for the recovery of the awarded amount to the extent of Rs. 96,09,563. In this case implementation of the award/ decree was deferred on so many hearings because of the alleged negotiation/ settlement communications between the decree holder/ award holder and judgment debtor/ award debtor as per the Ld. counsel for the judgment debtor but no fruitful result has been yielded till date. Therefore in view of the nature and age of the instant execution petition,

on the last date of hearing bailable warrants were issued as a coercive methods towards the satisfaction of the decree. No report has been submitted by the executing agency. Therefore office is again directed to issue fresh bailable warrants in the amount of Rs. 25000/- for appearance of the judgment debtor towards the satisfaction of the decree. Warrants be forwarded to Commissioner of Police Mumbai for execution. Put up for appearance of the judgment debtor and further proceedings on November 12, 2024.

DB stays contempt proceedings against Insurance Company

JAMMU: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court comprising Justice Sanjeev Kumar and Justice Sindhu Sharma stayed the contempt proceedings against IFFCO TOKIO General Insurance Company. DB also directed UT of Jammu and Kashmir is directed to utilize the premium amount of Rs. 427.73 crores lying with it for reimbursement of medical claims to the Empanelled Health Care Providers (EHCPs) under Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) Sehat scheme in Jammu and Kashmir, which, however, shall be subject to outcome of the present

appeal. This order has been passed in an appeal filed by the insurance company has challenged the judgment on various grounds including the one that the Single bench was not a duly constituted Commercial Division Court under the provisions of Section 4 of the Commercial Courts Act and hence did not have jurisdiction to entertain, adjudicate and consequently decide the issue. The J&K government launched Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana to provide free-of-cost Universal Health Coverage to all its residents, including the serving and retired employees and their families. The Scheme is intended to provide

the same benefits that were available under the AB PM-JAY SEHAT scheme, a Government of India Scheme, that provides annual health insurance cover of Rs 5 lakh per family on a floater and cashless basis through an established network of health care providers. Pertinently, the Scheme came to be introduced by the government with the object of reducing catastrophic health expenditure and improving access to quality healthcare to the domiciles of J&K. It is worthwhile to mention here that Writ Court directed IFFCO TOKIO General Insurance Company to continue with the existing arrangement to provide free of cost

Universal Health Coverage to all the residents of J&K including the serving and retired employees and their families under the AB-PMJAY SEHAT Scheme. It is also mention here that a three-year contract was awarded to IFFCO Tokio. In keeping with the contract, which commenced on March 15, 2022, and was to continue until March 14, 2025, the company had to provide health insurance coverage under the AB PM-JAY SEHAT scheme. The IFFCO TOKIO General Insurance Company had terminated the contract with effect from March 14, 2024. In the termination notice, the company had stated that though the insurance con-

tract was for 3 years, however, as per clause 9.1 (c) of the contract, the company had the right to terminate the contract even before the completion of the period of three years. On this aspect, the court did not agree and held that the insurance contract was for a minimum period of three years and the insurer had no right to terminate the contract before the expiry of that period. In response to a plea by the State Health Agency (SHA) that sought the court's intervention, in August this year, the single bench in its decision ruled that IFFCO Tokio must continue fulfilling its contractual responsibilities until the dispute is resolved through arbitration.
