6 vehicles for illegal mining seized

SAMBHA: Continuing its drive against illegal mining, Police has seized six vehicles in the jurisdiction of Police Station Samba and Police Station Ramgarh which were being used for illegal transportation/mining of the construction material. Police teams headed by SHO PS Samba and I/C BPP Kamore under PS Ramgarh while performing patrolling duty in their respective jurisdictional areas, have seized six tractor trolleys without registration Nos. which were being used for illegal transportation/mining of the construction material in the area. The above mentioned vehicles have been seized by Police and handed over to Geology & Mining Department, Samba for further legal action.

GRP Jammu seizes 3kg ganja, 69 bottles of illicit liquor, 2931 intoxicating capsules

JAMMU: Massive Search Operations have been initiated by GRP Jammu to thwart any sabotage as well as to curb illegal activities. During surprise checking of trains, Railway Stations and Railway tracks, GRP Jammu detected and seized 3kg ganja, 69 bottles of illicit liquor, 201 bottles of Corex, 600 tablets ALPAZOLAM, 2130 capsules SPASMO and 02 bottles of CODEINE containing narcotic like substance in the different cases registered at Police Station GRP Jammu/Kathua.

Two narcotics smugglers arrested; poppy straw recovered

SAMBHA: Continuing its drive against the narcotics smugglers, Police has arrested two narcotics smugglers and has recovered Poppy Straw from their possession in the jurisdiction of Police Station Samba. A Police Party of Police Post Mansar headed by I/C PP Mansar under SHO PS Samba during vehicle checking at Naka Mansar, intercepted a canter truck bearing registration No. PB13BG-4859 for its checking. During checking, Poppy Straw having value of approximately 55000 INR was recovered which was tactfully concealed inside the cabin of the canter truck. The accused has been identified as Bachiter Singh, son of Bir Singh and Ajay Pal son of Narinder Singh both R/o Amritsar (Punjab) have been arrested and the contraband item alongwith vehicle was also seized. In this regard, a case FIR No. 240/2024 U/S 8/15 NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Samba and further investigation started.

Theft case solved; woman arrested; stolen property recovered

ANANTNAG: Police in Anantnag have solved a theft case by arresting accused lady involved in the commission of crime and recovered stolen items from her possession. Police in Anantnag acting swiftly on a complaint filed by Ms. Shahzida Akhter wife of late Ghulam Nabi Parray resident of Shipora Larkipora, regarding theft of golden ornaments. A case vide FIR No. 181/2024 was registered and an investigation was promptly launched. During the investigation, Rehana, wife of Majid Dar and resident of Minward, was brought in for questioning. During questioning, she admitted the commission of crime and on her revelation, the stolen items, including, 01 Gold Bangle, 04 Gold Rings, 01 Jhumka, 01 Chain with a Pendulum worth approximately 73 lakhs, were recovered from her residence. Further investigation, led to the recovery of additional golden ornaments from the accused's house, including 02 Gold Bangles, 01 Jhumka, 01 Gold Chain, 02 Pendulums, 01 Pair of Earrings, 01 Pair of Tops, 01 Gold Ring, valued approximately 74.5 lakhs, bringing the total recoveries to 77.5 lakhs. The accused has been arrested and the investigation is going on.

Illicit liquor recovered, 4 arrested

ANANTNAG: In a major drive against illicit liquor, Police in Anantnag have arrested four individuals and seized a significant quantity of illicit liquor in various operations. During routine Naka checking at Tulkhan Crossing, a Police party from Police Post Sangam apprehended Javeed Ahmad Dar son of Gh Mohammad Dar resident of Tulkhan Bijbehara, who was found transporting several bottles of illicit liquor. He has been arrested and shifted to concerned police station. In another operation at Sarnal Chowk, a Police party from PP Sherbagh intercepted a motorcycle bearing registration number JK03A-3607 and recovered illicit liquor from the possession of motorcyclist Mohd Maqsood Mansoori son of Mohd Ishaq resident of Bana Ara Amarapur, District Banka, Bihar. Accused has been arrested and shifted to police station. Additionally, during a routine vehicle checking near GMC Dialgam, a passenger auto bearing registration number JK03G-0349 traveling from Larkipora to Anantnag was stopped. A search of the auto led to the recovery of multiple sealed bottles of illicit liquor; 02 individuals onboard, identified as Intiyaz Ahmad Trambo and Nazir Ahmad Rother, were arrested. Cases under relevant sections of law have been registered at Police Stations Bijbehara and Anantnag, and further investigations have been initiated.

Route marches cum briefings held for Nafri deployed for elections in rural zone of Jammu District

Three drug peddlers arrested, 400 grams Charas, 30 k cash recovered

JAMMU: In a significant achievement, Police Post Sarwal, while conducting routine Nakka duty at Talli Morh, apprehended three drug peddlers and seized 400 grams of charas, ₹30,000 in cash, two weighing machines, and various other incriminating items. During the operation, a motorcycle (JK02CU/5661) and a scooter (JK02BM/0142) were signaled to stop by the police. However, the riders attempted to flee, raising suspicion. The police swiftly intercepted both vehicles and identified the suspects as Pankaj Kumar (Newplot), Aryaman Mahajan (Vikas Nagar, Jammu), and Amit Sharma (Chenani, Udhampur). Upon a thorough search, charas, five mobile phones, one Apple tablet, a hookah, small packing pouches, and narcotic proceeds were recovered. With a firm commitment to eradicating drug-related crimes, the Jammu Police registered an FIR under relevant sections of law and launched an extensive investigation to uncover both the backward and forward links in the case. The arrest has brought relief to the local community, as these peddlers were endangering the lives of the youth.



Bovine smuggling attempt foiled, 12 bovines rescued

Kathua police recovers online defrauded amount of Rs. 20k

Pertinently, from the date of establishment, Cyber Cell Kathua has successfully recovered defrauded amount of Rs 26,56,161/- so far. This achievement of District Police Kathua underscores the unit's expertise, dedication and tireless efforts in safeguarding the common citizens against online fraud and cheating. Bootlegger with 55 bottles of illicit liquor

UDHAMPUR: In a concerted effort to combat illegal activities, District Police Udhampur have apprehended a bootlegger and seized 55 quarters of illicit liquor in the Thathi area of Udhampur. Jammu' Cyber cell solves online cyber frauds amounting to Rs 4,80,900

JAMMU: A complaint regarding financial fraud to the tune of Rs.1,70,000/- was received in cyber cell Jammu in which fraudster makes family relations with the victim and asked for financial help and victim lost hard earned money. In another complaint, the complainant received a Fake call from fraudsters posing himself as a Parcel delivery agent of Amazon and got Rs. 2,14,000/-transacted from his account. In yet another incident a complaint regarding online financial fraud of Rs.96,900/- in which the complainant invested in a AI Server landing platform company and Purchased plans and lost his money. With the timely intervention and showing the professional excellence meticulously ,Cyber Cell DPO Jammu started timely investigations into the complaints through its professional wings specifically trained for the purpose and within stipulated time the teams constituted for the cause got put on hold an aggregate amount of Rs 4,80,900/- out of Rs.4,80,900,which otherwise could have been misused and fraudulently transacted for various unfair means. District Police Jammu, equipped with advanced technology and skilled human resource has been in and around for the common masses to mitigate their grievances in the shortest possible time.

Narcotic bid foiled, smuggler arrested, 40 grams of heroin seized

JAMMU: In a significant breakthrough in the ongoing crackdown on drug-related activities, the Domana Police Station has registered a case FIR No. 231/2024 U/Ss 8/21/22/ NDPS Act following the arrest of one individual involved in the illegal possession of narcotics. The accused person was identified as Sharif Ahmed Sheikh S/O Mohd Ramzan Sheikh age 27 years R/O village Sheikpura Watnar tehsil Kokernag District Anantnag was apprehended with a substantial quantity of 40 grams in his possession. The arrest comes after a targeted operation by the Jammu Police aimed at curbing the flow of drugs in the region. Jammu police is actively pursuing further investigations into the case, with a focus on unraveling the broader network of suppliers and distributors that may be linked to the accused and is looking into all angles and the source of this narcotic supply to ensure a thorough crackdown. The arrest marks a significant step forward in the fight against drug trafficking in the area, with police urging the public to stay vigilant and report any suspicious activities that could help curb this growing menace. The police team of PP Pounichak successfully executed the recovery operation under the strategic leadership of SHO PS Domana. The operation was closely monitored by the SDPO Domana and the Superintendent of Police (SP) Rural Jammu, ensuring meticulous oversight throughout the process.
