Five drug peddlers arrested with heroin

JAMMU: In a relentless pursuit against drug peddlers, Jammu Police, under the operation "Sanjeevani," made a significant breakthrough on 15-09-2024. Police party of PS Nagrota during Naka checking duty intercepted the vehicle Alto K10 bearing Reg. No. JK06B/9811 at Naka Ban Toll Plaza during checking of vehicle approval 20/22 gram Heroin like substance recovered and three persons arrested namely Sunny Kumar, son of Chain Singh, resident of Paryote Teh.& Distt. Doda; Ashan Ali, son of Ghulam Farooq, resident of Paryote Doda and Aqib Farooq, son of Farooq Ahmed, resident of Khaleeni Doda.

In second case one vehicle Maruti 800 bearing Reg. No. JK04B/9507 intercepted at Naka Bamyal Morh jagti and during checking of vehicle approx 8/10 gram Heroin like substance recovered. Accused arrested on the spot namely Arshad Ahmed, son of Khazer Mohd Shah and Bilal Ahmed, son of Ghulam Qadir both residents of Lasjan Teh. Panthachowk Distt Srinagar.

The diligent efforts of the police team of PS Nagrota led by SHO Nagrota culminated in the arrest of the accused in different places.

In this connection two FIRs, FIR No.248/2024 and 249/2024 U/S 8/21/22/29 of NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Nagrota, marking a decisive step towards curbing the drug trade in the area.

Two bootleggers arrested with illicit liquor

UDHAMPUR: Intensifying its drive against the sale of illicit liquor, District Police Udhampur have arrested 02 bootleggers in the Jurisdiction of Police Station Chenani in two different cases.

Police Party of PS Chenani led by its SHO while performing Patrolling/vehicle checking duty in collaboration with Special Surveillance Team (SST) at Domail Chowk Chenani stopped one vehicle (matador) JK14A3839 for checking.

During checking of said vehicle 38 bottles of JK Special Whisky (37 bottles of 250ml and 01 bottle of 750 ml) were recovered from the driver of the vehicle namely Ashok, son of Mohan Lal, resident of Sudmahadev who has been arrested on spot.

In this regards, a case FIR No. 147/2024 U/S 48(A) Excise Act stands registered at PS Chenani and investigation of case

ongoing. In another instance Police party of Police Station Chenani apprehended another Bootlegger namely Rattan Lal, son of Ramesh Kumar, resident of Chullayar and recovered 28 more bottles of illicit liquor 24 bottles of 250ML and 04 bottles of 750 ml) from his possession.

In this regards another case FIR no. 148/2024, pursuant to section 48(a) of the Excise Act has been registered against him at Police Station Chenani and investigation set into motion.

Thief arrested, stolen jewellery recovered

stolen jewellery.

On September 15, 2024 one complaint received from Gourav Gupta, son of Sanjay Gupta, resident of Ward No. 7 Akhnoor Jammu regarding theft of Golden Chain by police station Akhnoor.

On this information a case FIR No. 166/2024 U/S 303(2) BNS has been registered and investigation started.

During investigation Police party of P/S Akhnoor analysed CCTV Footage minutely, based on the information gathered on human intelligence and technical support Police party of this P/S did hectic efforts and with timely human intervention rounded up suspects. During questioning one suspect namely Ashok Kumar, son of Thoru Ram, resident of Ghar Major Chowki Choura confessed about his involvement in above said case and on his disclosure stolen Golden chain weight approx.15 grams recovered from his residence by Police party headed by SHO Akhnoor. Further investigation of the case is going on.

7 drug peddlers arrested, psychotropic substances recovered

ANANTNAG: In its ongoing efforts to eliminate the drug menace from society, police arrested five drug peddlers in Anantnag and seized a substantial quantity of psychotropic/contraband substances from their possession.

In a significant operation, a police team from PS Mattan during naka at Bumzoo Mattan, intercepted an Innova vehicle bearing registration number JK02DK/9333 with three

persons on board. During searching of the vehicle, 11 bottles of Codeine Phosphate, 80 Dolo-T tablets, 70 OMODOL tablets, good quantity of Beer and Alcohol and a cash amount of Rs 11,500/- were recovered. The three accused persons identified as Lateef Ahmad Shah son of Mohammad Qasim Shah resident of Mattan, Ayaz Ahmad Bhat son of Mohammad Amin Bhat resident of Seer Hamdan, and Rayees Ahmad Malik son of Gh Mohammad Malik resident of Sarnal Payeen, Anantnag have been arrested on the spot. The contraband along with the vehicle used in the commission of crime has also been seized.

In another action, a police team from Police Station Anantnag at a checkpoint established near Wazir Bagh Park, Anantnag intercepted an auto bearing registration number JK01AK-7694. The auto, coming from Bangdar towards Mehandi Kadalwas searched, leading to the recovery of a good amount of illicit liquor. The accused driver identified as Riyaz Ahmad Dar son of Gh Qadir Dar resident of Zadipora, Anantnag was arrested and the auto used in the commission of crime was also seized.

Moreover, a Police team from Police Post Sangam during naka checking at Kudangan Marhama apprehended an individual identified as Noor Mohammad Ganie son of Ab Rahim Ganie resident of Marhama, who was carrying a bag with a significant quantity of alcohol. The accused was arrested and the contraband was seized on the spot.

All the accused persons have been arrested and shifted to respective police stations where they remain in custody. Cases under relevant sections of law have been registered in respective Police Stations and further investigation have been initiated. In a significant operation against drug trafficking, Police have arrested a drug peddler in Pulwama and recovered contraband substance from his possession.

Acting on reliable information, a police party from Police Station Pulwama at a checkpoint established at Circular Road Malikpora Crossing intercepted a vehicle bearing registration number JK01N-4401. During search, a polythene packet containing heroin was recovered from his possession. He has been identified as Fayaz Ahmad Tantray son of Manzoor Ahmad Tantray resident of Kremshore Khansahib, presently residing at Cheek Pulhoo Nowgam. During questioning, accused Fayaz failed to provide a valid explanation for possessing the contraband and was found to be involved in the illegal trade of heroin, selling the drug to local youth at exorbitant prices, thus contributing to drug addiction in the area. He has been arrested and shifted to police station where he remains in custody. Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 187/2024 under relevant sections of law has been registered in Police Station Pulwama and investigation has been initiated.

Continuing its drive against the drug peddlers and its propagators, Police have arrested drug peddler in Awantipora and recovered contraband substance from his possession.

A police party headed by SHP Police Station Awantipora under the supervision of SDPO Awantipora Shri during naka checking at Larkipora arrested one drug peddler identified as Ajaz Ahmad Shah son of Gh Mohd Shah resident of Larkipora Awantipora. During checking, 21.4Kgs of Charas like substance was recovered from his possession. He has been shifted to police station where he remains in custody.

Accordingly, a Case vide FIR Number 135/2024 under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Awantipora and investigation has been initiated.

GO inspects polling stations in AC-57 Reasi

REASI: In preparation for the upcoming assembly elections, the General Observer for AC-57 Reasi and AC-58 SMVD conducted a thorough inspection of three key polling stations on Monday.

Priority be given to education and employment: Contractual lecturers

SRINAGAR: The contractual lecturers in Jammu and Kashmir are intensifying their demands for salary enhancements, citing significant discrepancies between their earnings and those of their counterparts in the UT of Ladakh.

Currently, lecturers in Jammu and Kashmir say they are paid Rs 28,000 per month while those in Ladakh receive a monthly salary of Rs 57,700 as per UGC norms, which has angered contractual lecturers in Jammu & Kashmir.

Pertinently, the news of two Doctorate holders, who have worked as contractual lecturers in the past, now selling dry fruits on a cart in Shopian created a wave of sympathy for the current unemployed professionals, who work on meagre salaries.

Speaking to STATE TIMES, the contractual lecturers said that they perform the same duties and responsibilities as their peers in Ladakh, yet they are compensated with nearly half the salary.

This discrepancy, they say, is causing significant financial strain on them and their families, particularly in a time when the cost of living continues to rise.

He said that education system should be given priority in the manifesto of every political party but unfortunately the leaders are engaged in war of words which is no longer useful for the new generation. "Right now we need jobs in government sector, our future generation is suffering due to contractual staff in colleges, and this time the arrangements are yet to be made and most of the academic session is over", he added.

"The elections are going to be held. We hope that new government will give priority to the process of permanent employment because the contract system has caused a lot of damage to our education system" a female contractual lecturer said.

"We work just as hard as our counterparts in Ladakh, often under more challenging conditions. How can the government justify paying us so much less? It is not just unfair to us as professionals, but it also impacts our ability to provide for our families. We are not asking for anything extraordinary, just equal pay for equal work," said another contractual lecturer.

He said their lower pay not only affects their current living conditions but also their future, as they are unable to save adequately for retirement or invest in their children's education.

Pertinently, the feeling of being undervalued and overworked is widespread among the contractual teaching community in Jammu and Kashmir.

"Every month, we struggle to make ends meet. The disparity in salaries is a clear indication of how little the government values our contribution to the education system," Shazia Mir, another lecturer, said.

"It's demoralizing and makes us question our worth as educators. We deserve the same respect and compensation as our colleagues in Ladakh", he added.

The lecturers said they have approached various government bodies, including the Directorate of Higher Education, however, they say their demand for an enhanced salary has not been met. A senior government official, wishing anonymity, declined to comment on the issue, but added that it has been brought to government's attention.
