Stampede at Mata Vaishno Devi Bhawan DB grants time to Petitioner to respond to GAD's Statement of Facts

JAMMU: In the much publicized Public Interest Litigation (PIL No. 12/2022) and the Contempt Petition (CPT(D) No. 22/2024) seeking disclosure of the 3-Member Enquiry Report submitted by the said Committee constituted by the Govt. of J&K vide Govt Order No. 01-JK(GAD) of 2022 dated January 1, 2022, which was assigned the task to examine in detail the causes/reasons behind the unfortunate stampede at the Bhawan of Mata Vaishno Devi, Katra in the intervening night of December 31, 2021/January 1, 2022 which resulted in the death of 12 pilgrims and injuries to several devotees, a Division Bench of the High Court of J&K and Ladakh at Jammu (through Virtual Mode) comprising of Chief Justice (Acting) Tashi Rabstan and Justice M. A. Chowdhary granted time to Advocate H.A. Siddiqui with Advocate Supriya Chouhan appearing for the petitioner to file response to the Statement of Facts filed by the General Administration Department, Govt. of J&K. When the Contempt petition filed by the Petitioner-Advocate Sheikh Shakeel Ahmed alleging non-compliance of the Judgement dated April 26, 2023 passed in WP(C) PIL No.12/2022 came up for hearing, Advocate H.A. Siddiqui with Advocate Supriya Chouhan appearing for the Whistleblower/Petitioner drew the attention of the Division Bench towards the Para-16 of the said Judgment wherein the Division Bench while closing the PIL had observed that the Division Bench has not been apprised about the report of the 03 members Committee and the said Committee had been constituted to point out the lapses and fix the responsibility of erring Officers/Officials behind the incident. Advocate H.A. Siddiqui further submitted that the Learned Advocate General appearing for the Government of J&K had assured the Division Bench that appropriate action as warranted in terms of the report will be taken and in light of the assurance extended by the Learned Advocate General for the Union Territory of J&K, the Division Bench had directed the Government of J&K and Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board(SMVD SB) to take effective steps in furtherance of the decision/recommendations of the said Committee so constituted for ensuring safety of the pilgrims and

devotees. Advocate H.A. Siddiqui with Advocate Supriya Chouhan vehemently argued that in the Statement of Facts filed by the Commissioner/Secretary to Government of J&K, General Administration Department, there is no whisper with regard to the causes and reasons behind the incident and there is no mention with regard to the lapses on the part of the delinquent Officers/Officials which resulted into the unfortunate stampede taking 12 innocent lives and the Statement of Facts filed by GAD is just the replica of the objections filed in the main PIL and there is no change in the stance taken in the Statement of Facts filed by the GAD meaning thereby that the Government of J&K did not implement the report of the 03-Members Committee and the directions issued by the Division Bench on April 26th, 2023 while closing the PIL. Advocate H.A. Siddiqui with Advocate Supriya Chouhan further submitted that even during the pendency of the PIL, the Government of J&K did not produce the report of 03-Members Committee which had been granted 07 days time to identify the lapses and to fix the responsibility in the matter but the said report was kept as a 'Guarded Secret' for the reasons best known to the GAD. Advocate Siddiqui requested the Division Bench that the Enquiry Report be summoned and the same should be perused by the Court as the matter is of wide public importance. After considering the submissions of Advocate H.A. Siddiqui with Advocate Supriya Chouhan appearing for the petitioner, the Division Bench headed by Chief Justice (Acting) Tashi Rabstan observed and directed in the open Court that the submissions made be filed in the shape of a response by the petitioner to the Statement of Facts filed by the GAD by or before the next date of hearing so that the matter may be finally considered. Government Advocate Eishaan Dadhihi appeared for GAD whereas Advocate Atul Verma vice Advocate Adarsh Sharma appeared for Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board, Katra. Looking into the importance of the matter, the Division Bench directed the Registry to Re-notify the instant Contempt Petition on October 21, 2024.

implementation of the judgment and order dated May 4, 2022, passed in the above-titled writ petition. Advocate Yatin Mahajan appearing for the AAY, submitted that a Letters Patent Appeal, bearing LPA No. 105/2022, was preferred against the order dated May 4, 2022. He further submits that the LPA has been allowed, and the judgment of the writ court was set aside by an order dated September 9, 2024. He has placed on record the judgment of the Division Bench dated September 9, 2024. Court observed that in view of the fact that the judgment of the writ court dated May 4, 2022 has been set aside, the proceedings in this contempt petition are closed.

(b) Individual artisans/weavers/craftsmen enrolled/registered with Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India Limited (TRIFED)/National Handloom Development Corporation (NHDC)/Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) etc.
(c) Self Help Groups registered with PMEGP (Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme).
(d) Marginalized or weaker sections of society.
5. The applicant will have to submit an undertaking to the Station Superintendent indicating that no activity would be undertaken to adversely affect the train operations, passenger safety and image of the Railways.
6. Application should be addressed and can be submitted to Station Superintendent at Station by the applicant.
7. A maximum of 20 units of electricity per OSOP outlet shall be permitted for one spell of 15 days as basic facilitation subsumed in the registration charges. For additional units of electricity over and above the limit of 20 units, the applicable charges shall apply on actual basis.
