HC quashes two PSA detentions, orders release of detainees

■ STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: In two significant rulings, the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh at Jammu quashed the preventive detention of two individuals held under the Public Safety Act (PSA), citing violations of constitutional and statutory safeguards. Justice M.A. Chowdhary delivered the judgments in both cases, directing the release of the detainees forthwith if not required in any other case. In the first, Mohd. Jaffer

Sheikh (45), son of Ghulam Mohd Sheikh, resident of

Nattas, Dool, Kishtwar, had been detained under Order No. 6th/DM/K/PSA of 2024 dated November 7, 2024, passed by the District Kishtwar. Magistrate. Sheikh, represented by S. S. Ahmed, Advocate, argued that the detention order was based on stale cases, vague reports, and that he was denied crucial constitutional rights, including timely communication of his right to representation.

The government, represented by Eishaan Dadhichi, GA, defended the detention citing his alleged role as an

"Over Ground Worker" linked to anti-national activities and potential threats to the Pakal-Dul hydroelectric project. However, the court found multiple lapses: reliance on decades-old and pending FIRs without proximate link, failure to communicate the time frame for representation, and nonsupply of complete material. The court held the order arbitrary and quashed the detention, directing Sheikh's

In the second, Sunil Kumar alias Kashu (25), son of late Krishan Lal, res-

ident of Radwan (Khurd), Ramgarh, Samba, detained under Order No. 01/PSA of 2025 dated January 25, 2025 by the District Magistrate, Samba. His petition, filed through his mother Nirmla Devi, was argued by Satyajeet, Advocate, who contended that the grounds of detention were not explained to him in a language he understood, that material was withheld, and that FIRs cited did not justify preven-

tive detention. The respondents, represented by Bhanu Jasrotia,

GA, maintained that Sunil Kumar was repeatedly involved in criminal activities, including seven FIRs ranging from Arms Act violations to cattle smuggling cases, and that his actions posed a threat to public order. The court, however, observed that most FIRs pertained to minor offences under IPC Section 188 and the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, which did not amount to a public order threat. It ruled that ordi-

nary criminal law was suffi-

cient to deal with such alle-

gations and that PSA could

not be used as a shortcut. Consequently, the detention was set aside and Sunil Kumar was ordered to be released.

Both rulings underscore the High Court's firm stance that preventive detention, being an exceptional measure curtailing personal liberty, must strictly comply with constitutional guarantees under Article 22(5). The court stressed that failure to provide material, reliance on stale or irrelevant FIRs, and denial of effective representation rights vitiate detention orders.

HC strikes down Govt bar under S-432, rules landowners free to alienate land without prior permission

JAMMU: In a significant judgment with far-reaching implications for land rights in Jammu and Kashmir, the High Court of J&K and Ladakh at Jammu has ruled that landowners who acquired property under Government Order No. S-432 of 1966 cannot be compelled to seek prior government permission before alienating their

land. The court has directed the Union Territory administration to furnish revextracts (Fard Intekhab) to the petitioners, enabling them to proceed with transactions of their landholdings.

The verdict was delivered by Justice Sanjay Dhar while disposing of three connected writ petitions. The petitions were filed by Mohan Lal Angral, Karan Singh, and Ram Parshad & others, landowners from Samba and Kathua districts, who approached the court after revenue authorities declined to issue extracts citing the restrictive clause of the 1966 government order.

The petitioners were represented by Aseem Kumar Sawhney, Sr. Advocate Kashif Malik, Advocate and Bhavesh Bhushan, Advocate. The government was represented by Monika Kohli, Senior Additional Advocate General.

The petitioners argued that once proprietary rights were granted in

The High Court of Jammu Kashmir and Ladakh has announced changes in its judicial calendar for the Jammu Wing, declaring September $12, 202\overline{5}$ (Friday) as a non-sitting

As per Notification No. 2930 of 2025/RGJNG-15(1) dated September 11, 2025, issued by the Registrar General's office at Srinagar, the lost working day will be compensated by treating September 27, 2025 (Saturday) as a working

Additionally, November 8, 2025 (Saturday) has also been declared a working day for the Jammu Wing in lieu of August 27, 2025 (Wednesday), which was declared a holiday earlier due to flood-like conditions in Jammu.

1966, they were absolute owners of the land and could not be restrained from alienation, relying on precedents including Mohammad Akbar Shah vs State (AIR 2017 J&K 14) and Angrez Singh vs UT of J&K (AIR 2023 J&K 533). The government, however, insisted that the condition of prior permission for alienation was binding, and therefore, no Fard Intekhab could be issued without such approval.

Justice Sanjay Dhar, after examining the records and earlier rulings, observed that the issue was no longer res integra. The court reiterated that the clause requiring government permission had become otiose after proprietary rights were conferred, and could not be enforced to limit ownership.

He noted that the very purpose of the restriction in 1966 was to ensure agricultural use at a time when farming was the backbone of the State's economy. However, with the shift in economic realities and subsequent legislative changes, the restriction had lost its relevance. The court pointed out that the landmark judgment in Mohammad Akbar Shah's

case had already settled the controversy, declaring that once ownership rights were conferred, landholders were governed by the Transfer of Property Act and Agrarian Reforms Act, not by the outdated condition of the 1966 order. The judge also emphasized that the government had not challenged or secured a stay against these earlier judgments in higher

lar cases. Rejecting the government's plea to defer hearing, Justice Dhar held: "It is not open to the respondents to refuse issuance of revenue extract in respect of the land owned and possessed by the petitioners on the ground that the same has been acquired by them in terms of Government Order No. S-432 of 1966."

With this ruling, the petitions were allowed, and the authorities were directed to furnish the revenue extracts for the land parcels in question. The order is expected to impact a large number of landholders across Jammu and Kashmir who had been facing hurdles in land transactions due to the continued insistence on government permission
