DODA/JAMMU: Security have launched a search operation in a remote village in Doda district following information about the movement of three suspected terrorists there, a senior police officer said.

Senior Superintendent of Police, Doda, Sandeep Mehta, said the operation was launched in the Bhallara area of Thathri on Friday evening and was continuing. Officials said police, assisted by the Army, cordoned off a vast area of the village and adjoining forests, but there has been no contact with the

JAMMU: The pilgrimage to the Mata Vaishno Devi shrine, which was scheduled to restart on Sunday after remaining suspended for 19 days, has been postponed again till further orders amid incessant rains, the shrine board said on Saturday.

The pilgrimage was suspended on August 26, hours before a major landslide hit the route leading to the shrine that resulted in the death of 34 pilgrims and injuries to 20 others.

Authorities order closure of unlicensed brick kilns within 8 km radius of Srinagar airport



National Conference (NC) president Farooq Abdullah on Saturday said he is hopeful the Centre will respect the aspirations of the people of Jammu and Kashmir and restore its statehood.

The three-time former chief minister of the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir was in Pahalgam as a guest of honour at a golf tournament in which around 50 golfers from across the country are participating.

Asked if he was hopeful of restoration of Jammu and Kashmir's statehood, Abdullah told PTI Videos, "God willing, that will also happen one day. We are hope-

ful that Delhi will pay attention to it. The prime minister will see to it that the people of Jammu and Kashmir want statehood to be restored". To a question on whether
