LEH: Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, Kavinder Gupta, chaired the 13th State Board for Wildlife meeting, underlining the need to balance national security priorities with the protection of Ladakh's fragile biodiversity and high conservation value

Highlighting Ladakh's strategic significance and ecological sensitivity, the Lt Governor stressed that development must integrate robust environmental safeguards. He recommended the realignment of roads, power lines, and infrastructure to avoid disruption of critical wildlife habitats.

Emphasis was also placed on ensuring all sewage and wastewater be treated through Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs) as per envi-

Following comprehensive discussions, the Board granted wildlife clearances for key infrastructure projects. These included defencerelated developments and road connectivity works, along with proposals by the Power Development Department (PDD) in the Karakoram and Changthang wildlife sanctuaries. 


