

JAMMU: A high-level delegation of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Jammu & Kashmir, led by Party President Sat Sharma, and Leader of Opposition Sunil Sharma on Monday met Union Home Minister Amit Shah and submitted a detailed memorandum in the presence of Lieutenant Governor, Manoj Sinha.

It, therefore, urged that the calamity be declared a "National Disaster" and that a Comprehensive Relief and Rehabilitation Package be sanctioned to enable immediate assistance and long-term rehabilitation. The delegation pointed out that roads, bridges, and essential services like water supply, electricity, and communication have been badly disrupted, while thousands of kanals of agricultural land have been destroyed under sand and boulders. Farmers have lost standing crops and livestock, calling for immediate compensation and provision of free ration for at least six months until new crops

The BJP also demanded adequate support for families whose houses and belongings have been damaged, including repair grants for partially damaged dwellings. Businesses, shops, and smallscale industries have been hit hard and require revival assistance. Educational institutions across urban and rural

private, have sustained significant damage, necessitating compensation to restore normal functioning.

The memorandum further underlined the urgent need for restoration and upgradation of public infrastructure, particularly in the water supply, power, sewerage, and drainage sectors. It stressed desilting of drains and nallahs on a war footing to avert health and sanitation risks.

For long-term measures, the delegation proposed dredging and channelization of major rivers such as the Chenab. Jammu Tawi, and Balol Nallah, along with tributaries Rajouri, Poonch. Udhampur, Samba, and Kathua, which repeatedly cause floods every few years. A comprehensive plan for Chenab has already been submitted to the Government of India and requires early approval. The delegation emphasized that only a central intervention through a national disaster declaration and special package can adequately address the crisis, provide relief to affected fam-

World speaks in one voice against terrorism at SCO; A historic win for India: Gaurav

JAMMU: BJP Spokesperson J&K UT Gaurav Gupta said that the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation's (SCO) Tianjin Declaration marks a historic moment for India and for the global fight against terrorism. For the first time, the world has spoken in one united voice not only against terrorists, but also against those who organise, fund, and sponsor terror-

He said the Pahalgam terror attack of April 22, 2025, in which 26 innocent lives were lost, was a barbaric act that shook the conscience of humanity. "In the Tianjin Declaration, SCO member states strongly condemned the massacre, expressed condolences to the families of the victims, and categorically stated that perpetrators, organisers and sponsors of such attacks must be brought to justice. This is a resounding endorsement of India's longstanding stand under the decisive leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi Ji," Gupta stated.

He said the Tianjin Declaration, adopted unanimously by all SCO member states-including Russia, China, and even Pakistan-categori-

cally condemned the barbaric attack in which 26 innocent lives were lost. Importantly, the declaration went beyond perfunctory statements and asserted that perpetrators, organisers, and sponsors of terrorism must be brought to justice. "This is nothing less than a global endorsement of India's long-standing stance that state-backed terrorism cannot go unpunished," Gupta said.

Gupta underlined that the declaration assumes even greater significance because it was adopted in the presence of Pakistan's Prime s a collective body has now sent out. a strong and united message that the use of extremist groups for political or mercenary purposes is unaccept-

He recalled how Prime Minister Modi Ji, while addressing the summit plenary, powerfully invoked the Pahalgam massacre as not just an attack on India, but a direct challenge to humanity itself. Modi Ji stressed that India has been at the forefront of the global fight against terrorism for four decades, opposing terror-financing and extremist networks with unwavering determination. Gupta said, "The Prime Minister's clear stand that double standards on terrorism will no longer be accepted has now found resonance in the SCO joint declaration."

LMD imposes penalty on 2 cement manufacturers

JAMMU: Under the supervision of Controller Legal Metrology J&K, the Legal Metrology Department has imposed penalties on two cement manufacturers for failing to legibly declare mandatory information on their product packaging.

Controller Deputy Protection Consumer Jammu imposed a penalty of Rs 1.25 lakh on the two manufacturers for violation of packaging norms as prescribed under the Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules.

The violations included failure to clearly display critical consumer information such as Maximum

Retail Price (MRP), packing date, name of manufacturer. consumer helpline number, andmost importantly-the net weight of the cement bags.

These declarations are mandatory to uphold the consumer's Right to be informed and ensure transparency in the sale of packaged commodities.

manufacturers admitted their guilt and the cases were accordingly compounded for a total amount of Rs 1.25 lakh. They have also been issued a formal warning to exercise greater care and compliance in the future.

Commenting on the action, Controller Legal Metrology J&K, Rajinder Singh Tara, said, "The Department will not tolerate any violation of consumer rights.

Every manufacturer and trader is duty-bound to provide clear and accurate information to the consumers. Any attempt to mislead or hide crucial details will invite strict legal action.

The Legal Metrology Department reiterates its commitment to enforcing the law strictly and protecting consumers from unfair trade practices. Department has made it clear that any future violations will attract harsher penalties and stricter enforcement, including prosecution
