

JAMMU: In view of ongoing inclement weather conditions across the country, Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) has extended the last date for fresh admission and re-registration for the July 2025 session till 15th September 2025. This decision was taken with the approval of the Vice Chancellor to facilitate learners affected by adverse weather.

However, this extension does not apply to sixmonth certificate and semester-based programmes, the admission for which has already closed. Re-registration for the new semester or academic year will be allowed with a late fee of Rs.
