Compensatory time of 20 minutes per hour of examination shall be provided for eligible persons with benchmark disabilities [certi ied by the Standing Medical Board or a Medical Board constituted by the Government for the purpose, as per rule 17 of Jammu and Kashmir Public Service Commission (Conduct of Examination) Rules, 2022].

In case of remaining categories of persons with benchmark disabilities (PwBD), the facility of scribe and compensatory time will be provided on production of a certificate at the time of examination to the effect that the person concerned has physical limitation to write and scribe is essential to write examination on his behalf, from the Chief Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon/Medical Superintendent of a Government Health Care Institution as per proforma as Annexure-A.
