UDHAMPUR: Seventh day of the Swasth Nari Shakshat Parivar Abhiyaan (SNSPA) campaign, special emphasis was laid on Tuberculosis screening across District Udhampur. Women were actively screened for TB through sputum examination, chest X-rays, and clinical

evaluation, ensuring early detection and timely referral for treatment. In addition, routine screenings for hypertension, diabetes, anaemia, and common cancers also continued at all health facilities.

Awareness sessions were conducted to educate beneficiaries about TB symptoms,

the importance of early diagnosis, adherence to treatment, and community support available under the National TB Elimination Programme.

CMO Udhampur, Dr. Anil Manhas, along with DTO Dr. Anil Saloch, visited CHC Chenani to review the TB-focused campaign activities. They interacted with the staff and beneficiaries, encouraged health workers to intensify efforts for identifying presumptive TB cases, and stressed on linking every detected patient with proper care and support.

The campaign continues to receive positive response from the public, with increasing awareness about TB and preventive health among women in the district.
