HC pulls up officials for defying orders, warns of contempt action

JAMMU: The High Court of J&K and Ladakh has come down heavily on senior government officials for failing to comply with a writ court judgment, despite dismissal of their appeal. Justice Wasim Sadiq Nargal, while hearing CCP(S) No. 364/2024 in WP(C) No. 2167/2021, observed that the respondents are in "recurring contempt" as they continue to delay implementation of the order even after the Letters Patent Appeal filed by the Union Territory was dismissed. The Court noted that the Principal Secretary, Finance Deptt sought exemption from personal appearance through an affidavit sworn by an under secretary, which was rejected as unacceptable. The application was later withdrawn unconditionally. Meanwhile, the DC Rajouri appeared virtually in compliance with court directions. Justice Wasim Nargal remarked that merely filing a review petition does not render the writ court judgment ineffective, and the respondents were bound to implement the order "in letter and spirit." The Court granted the officials one last opportunity to comply, warning that failure to do so by the next date would compel the Court to frame a rule against them for contempt. The matter has been listed for October 13, 2025.

Contractual engagement beyond 'Till Further Orders' cannot be treated as mere session-based appointment: CAT

JAMMU: "Contractual clauses that deprive employees of fairness can be struck down when there is unequal bargaining power between the State and an individual. The applicant herein had no bargaining power and was compelled to accept repeated extensions on the department's terms. To deny her regularization despite continuous services against a clear vacant would amount to arbitrary and unequal treatment violating Articles 14 and 16 of the Constitution of India", observed the CAT.

The Central Administrative Tribunal, Jammu Bench, Jammu, comprising Rajinder Singh Dogra (J) and Ram Ram Mohan Johri (A) while pronouncing landmark judgment regarding the rights of the contractual/academic appointments to claim regularization, held that "The origin of Government service is contractual. There is an offer and acceptance in every case. But once appointed to his/her post or Office, the Government servant acquires a status and his/her rights and obligations are no longer determined by consent of both parties, but by statute or statutory rules. In other words, the legal position of a Government servant is more one of status than of contract. The hall mark of status is attachment to a legal relationship of rights and duties imposed by public law and not by mere agreement of the parties. The legal relationship is

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something entirely different, something in the nature of status. The rights of the civil servants in this country are guaranteed by the Constitution of India, civil rules and the service conditions." The applicant - Dr Aditi Sharma, having been engaged as Lecturer in the discipline of Prosthodontics, on contractual/academic arrangement in Indira Gandhi Government Medical College, Jammu, against a clear and available vacancy, which remained unfilled despite being advertised multiple times, including notification dated June 8, 2023 issued by J&K Public Service Commission, sought regularization of her services invoking writ jurisdiction through Dinesh Singh Chauhan, and Damini Singh Chauhan, Advocates.

It was argued that since the applicant was appointed against the said post in due compliance to the

Recruitment Rules as well as method of Recruitment duly provided in the Advertisement Notification. The applicant having been continuously serving since 2014 without any break, thereby, fulfilling the eligibility criteria for regularization under the J&K Civil Services Special Provision Act, 2010.

The continued engagement of the applicant on contractual basis, without extending consequential benefits of regularization, results in exploitation and violation of her constitutional rights. The State being the model employer, cannot take advantage of the helplessness of educated youth by keeping them in perpetual contractual status, by depriving her of regularization while acting arbitrarily and contrary to the spirit of equality before law.

"The exclusion in Section 3 (b) of the J&K Civil Services Special Provision Act, 2010

cannot be mechanically applied to her case. Once the respondents themselves continued her engagement year after year "till further orders" and "till selection", her appointment ceased to be a mere academic session arrangement.

She therefore falls within the class of contractual/consolidated employees protected by Section 5. Having completed seven years, having entered service with the requisite qualifications, having served against a clear vacancy without blemish, the applicant has statutory right for regularization.

The respondents were bound to place her case before Empowered Committee under Section 10, which they failed to do", held the Division Bench. Union Territory of J&K through Health & Medical Education Department was represented by Sudesh Mangotra, AAG.

HC quashes PSA detention of bovine smuggler

JAMMU: In a significant ruling, the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh at Jammu has quashed the preventive detention of Ghulam Qadar, a resident of Chenani, Udhampur, who had been booked under the Public Safety Act (PSA), 1978 as a habitual bovine smuggler.

The detention order, issued by the District Magistrate Udhampur in December 2024 and approved by the Home Department, had described Qadar as a repeat offender whose activities threatened communal harmony and public order. He was lodged in Central Jail Kot Bhalwal under Order No. 15-PSA-2024.

Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul, while pronouncing the judgment reserved earlier this month, held that the detention was "unwarranted, misconceived and illegal" as it was based on stale incidents of 2023 that had already culminated in convictions with fines. The Court observed that there was no fresh material to justify preventive detention and emphasized that PSA cannot


be used as a substitute for ordinary criminal proceedings under the Code of Criminal Procedure. The judgment underlined that vague and unsubstantiated grounds of detention violate constitutional rights under Article 21 and 22(5).

Authorities had relied on three FIRs registered in 2023 in which Qadar was convicted and fined for transporting cattle illegally. The District Magistrate had argued that such activities posed a risk of disturbing communal harmony. However, the Court noted that no actual law-and-order disturbance or communal tension was recorded in connection with those cases.

The Court set aside the detention order and directed the immediate release of Qadar from preventive custody unless required in any other case. This judgment once again brings focus on the judicial scrutiny of PSA detentions, with the Court stressing that liberty cannot be curtailed on vague grounds and that preventive detention laws must be applied with utmost care and precision.

Whereas, Deputy Director, Government Sheep Breeding & Research Farm, Reasi/Zaban has reported that there is no outstanding/compliant/RDA case/Vigilance case pending against the official and salary has been paid to the official up to 08-06-2025; and

Whereas, as reported by Vigilance Section of General Administration Department vide Form No. 363196 dated 17-09-2025, there is nothing adverse against Mr. Bhader Singh; and

Whereas, the matter has been examined/considered with reference to the rules governing the subject and it has been observed that the above mentioned official has completed his probation and qualified the prescribed period of service; and

Whereas, Article 200 of Jammu and Kashmir Civil Service Regulations, 1956 Volume-I provides as under: -

"200. Resignation and dismissals: Resignation of the public service or removal from it for misconduct, insolvency, inefficiency not due to age or failure to pass a prescribed examination, entails forfeiture of past service."

Now, therefore, in terms of Article 200 of Jammu and Kashmir Civil Services Regulations, 1956 Volume-I, the resignation tendered by Mr. Bhader Singh S/o Mohinder Singh R/o 59-Banna Reasi Tehsil Reasi District Reasi from the post of MTS (Fieldman) is hereby accepted with effect from 09-06-2025 forenoon, on his own request.
