JAMMU: Minister for Food, Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs, Transport, Youth Services and Sports, Satish Sharma today conducted an extensive inspection of the Tawi river embankments to assess the water level situation and review the preparedness of the district administration in dealing with any flood-related eventualities.

He was accompanied by ADC Jammu Anusya Jamwal, senior officers from Flood Control. Irrigation & PHE, Revenue, and Disaster Management departments.

The Minister, during the visit, took stock of the safety measures put in place to protect habitations located along the river banks and in adjoining low-lying areas. He was briefed by officials

machinery, availability of rescue boats, positioning of medical and relief teams as well as arrangements for temporary shelter camps in case of emergencies.

While interacting with the officers on the ground, the Minister directed them to maintain round-the-clock monitoring of the river water level and ensure a swift communication mechanism between field staff and control rooms. He asked for the immediate dissemination of alerts to the public in vulnerable areas so that people can be safely evacuated at the earliest in case of any

exigency. Minister further stressed upon ensuring ade-

ing water, medicines and other essentials at relief centres. He directed the Civil Supplies department to make advance provisions so that no family faces hardship in the event of displace-

Expressing satisfaction over the arrangements already made, Satish Sharma said the government has put in place a robust mechanism for flood preparedness, but constant vigilance and coordinated response are critical in dealing with such natural challenges. He appealed to the general public to remain calm yet cautious and to cooperate fully with the administration by following advisories and safety guide-

In a humanitarian gesture, the Minister announced that he will be donating his two months' salary to the Chief

Minister's Relief Fund, reaffirming towards supporting relief and rehabilitation efforts. He said that such contributions, though modest, can go a long way in extending timely help to families affected by natural calami-

"The safety and welfare of the people is our topmost priority. The government is fully geared up to respond to any situation and all possible assistance will be extended to safeguard lives and property. We stand shoulder to shoulder with our people in this hour of need", the Minister maintained.

The Minister assured that the administration will remain on high alert until the situation normalizes and reiterated that proactive steps will be taken to mitigate risks and minimize

witnessed unprecedented damage due to the recent spell of heavy rains, leaving several parts of the city waterlogged and the residents distressed.

The incessant downpour has particularly affected low-lying areas, where water mixed with heavy silt and debris entered homes, causing severe inconvenience and damage to property.

In the emerging situation, the Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC) has immediately swung into action, deploying teams headed by nodal officers including Transport officers and sanitation officers with prime focus on flood hit areas by pressing additional machinery into service to address the crisis.

To increase the manpower for restoration works, as many as 200 extra Nallah labours were hired on emergency basis for muck cleaning



Massive cleanliness drives are being undertaken at a war footing to clear the accumulated mud and debris from the affected areas.

Along with the mobilization of available machinery, extra machinery was hired to combat this situation.

Prominent among the worst-hit localities are Peer Ko, Gorakh Nagar, Rajendra Nagar and Gujjar Nagar, where operations are on round-the-clock to restore normal living conditions.

Some of the areas of Gujjar Nagar, Rajinder Nagar, Sangrampur were cleared and work on other areas is in progress on fast track basis.

The overflow of the Tawi River has further aggravated the situation, inundating its adjoining areas and leading

DB quashes Bar Council order, restores advocate's enrollment

JAMMU: The High Court of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh has set aside the Bar Council's order cancelling the provisional license of Advocate John Mohammad Wani, holding the action as arbitrary and contrary to procedure.

A Division Bench of Justice Javed Iqbal Wani and Justice Moksha Khajuria Kazmi directed that Wani be treated as enrolled with the State Council December 31, 2019, to March 27, 2023, the date he assumed charge as Prosecuting Officer in the Government service.

Wani was provisionally enrolled as an advocate in December 2019 after completing his integrated law degree from the Central

University of Kashmir. His license was extended periodically, $_{
m the}$ extension being valid up to March 2024.

In October 2022, Wani submitted his final law degree and applied for conversion of his provisional license into a permanent one. While this application remained pending, he was selected as Prosecuting Officer by the J&K Public Service Commission and formally appointed on March 27,

Subsequently, on August 5, 2024, the Bar Council cancelled his provisional license citing Rule 49 of the Bar Council of India Rules, which prohibits advocates from practicing law while in full-time salaried employment.

Represented by Senior Advocate Syed Faisal Qadri with Advocate Mariya Ashraf, the petitioner contended that the Bar Council acted without jurisdiction. The license was cancelled despite his application for permanent enrollment being pending well before his appointment in government serv-

It was further argued that the Bar Council failed to invoke disciplinary procedures under Section 35 of the Advocates Act and that the impugned order deprived him of recognition for the practice he had undertaken from 2019 to 2023.

Appearing for the Bar Council, Advocate Shah Aamir maintained that the petitioner ceased to be an

joined government service. The Council held that his provisional enrollment had expired in March 2024 and his claim for permaenrollment was devoid of merit.

The Bar Council also alleged that the petitioner concealed his appointment in government service and submitted documents in a manner contrary to rules.

The Bench, after examining the sequence of events, observed that the Bar Council had delayed processing the petitioner's application for a permanent license for over five months before his appointment. The court held that such delay could not be attributed to the petition-

While Rule 49 bars

simultaneous practice and government service, the judges said the proper course was to restrict his right of practice from the date of his appointment and not to retrospectively cancel his enrollment.

"The impugned order and notification are unreasonable to say the least," the court remarked, adding that the Bar Council's action ignored the principles of natural justice and fair play.

Allowing the writ petition, the High Court quashed Order No. 1202 of 2024 and Notification No. 1677 of 2024, restoring Wani's enrollment as an advocate from his initial date of registration in 2019 until March 27, 2023, when he formally joined government service. essential services and provide immediate relief to the the public. HC upholds 10-year sentence in family murder case

JAMMU: The High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh has upheld the conviction of Gul Mohammad Khan of Doda under Section 304-II RPC, ruling that the 2012 Chenab river tragedy was a case of culpable homicide due to negligence, not premeditated murder. The court rejected the Union Territory's appeal seeking his conviction for murder under Sections 302/201 RPC.

A Division Bench comprising Justice Sanjeev Kumar and Justice

Sanjay Parihar observed that the prosecution had failed to prove evond reasonable doubt that Khan had intentionally killed his wife and two daughters by pushing their Maruti van into the Chenab river. Instead, it held that the trial court was correct in convicting him for a negligent act committed with knowledge of its likely consequences. On March 24, 2012, Khan was driving a Maruti van with his wife Rubina Begum, daughter Hiqra, and an infant when the vehicle plunged nearly 600 feet into the Chenab at Reggy Nallah, killing all three. Initially booked under Sections 279 and 304-A RPC, the charges were later enhanced to murder citing marital discord and Khan's alleged resentment over having two daughters. In September 2021, the Additional Sessions Judge, Doda acquitted Khan of murder but convicted him under Section 304-II RPC, sentencing him to 10 years rigorous imprisonment and a fine of Rs 50,000. Upholding that verdict, the High Court pointed to contradictions in prosecution testimony, a weak motive theory, and the unreliable account of an alleged eye-witness, whose statement was recorded more than a month after the incident. The prosecution has failed to prove beyond reasonable doubt that the respondent murdered his wife and two children. The trial court was right in convicting him under Section 304-II and acquitting him of murder," the Bench observed while dismissing the UT's appeal. The conviction and sentence of 10 years rigorous imprisonment with a Rs 50,000 fine thus remain intact.

Court denies anticipatory bail in 250 Kg poppy straw case state times news

JAMMU: The Court of Special Judge (NDPS Cases), Jammu, YP Sharma has rejected the anticipatory bail application of Fayaz Ahmad Dar of Palhallan, Baramulla, accused of supplying 250 kilograms of poppy straw seized by the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) in Jammu in July 2021.

Delivering the order, Special Judge Y.P. Sharma observed that Dar had violated interim bail conditions, failed to cooperate with investigators despite repeated notices, and allegedly played a central role in a drug trafficking network. The Court underlined that custodial interrogation was essential to complete the investigation. The case stems from the seizure of 250 kg of poppy straw from Janak Singh at Narwal Mandi, Jammu, on 16th July 2021. During investigation, Dar allegedly emerged as the supplier. Although served notices under Section 67 of the NDPS Act, he did not appear before the agency for months. He had secured interim anticipatory bail on March 8, 2025, but treated it as "absolute bail," ignoring the condition to cooperate with the NCB. Counsel for the petitioner, Faisal Hasan, contended that Dar was innocent, falsely implicated, and entitled to bail on parity with co-accused Janak Singh, who had already been granted bail. He also cited several Supreme Court judgments, including Tofan Singh vs. State of Tamil Nadu. Court relied on recent Supreme Court pronouncements, including Dinesh Chander vs. State of Haryana, which upheld refusal of bail in similar narcotics cases. "Given the gravity of allegations, the petitioner's non-cooperation, and the mandate of Section 37 NDPS Act, anticipatory bail cannot be granted," the Court ruled. Accordingly, the interim protection granted on March $8,\,2025,$ was with drawn, and the application was dismissed.
