In a significant ruling, the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh at Jammu has quashed the termination of eight employees of the Municipal Committee, Thanamandi, District Rajouri, holding that their removal after nearly two decades of service was arbitrary and in violation of constitutional safeguards.

Chowdhary, while deciding a batch of eight writ peticastigated the authorities for revoking the employees' regularization "without adopting due course of law and without affording them an opportunity of being heard." The Court observed that such arbitrary action cannot withstand judicial scruti-

Justice Chowdhary noted that once the Director himself had approved the regularization, the employees could not be removed without following the due process of a departmental inquiry. The Court quashed eight termination orders (Nos. 131 to 138-DULBJ of 2024, all dated 24.07.2024), while leaving liberty with the authorities to proceed afresh in accordance with law, if neces-

The ruling brings major relief to the eight employees, many of whom had been serving the Municipal Committee for nearly 20 years, and underscores the Court's insistence on fairness and adherence to natural justice in matters of public employment.

#### DB upholds acquittal in murder case Presumption of innocence cannot be shaken without strong proof

JAMMU: The High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh at Jammu has upheld the acquittal of two accused in the 2002 Mahore murder case, reaffirming that the presumption of innocence of an accused cannot be disturbed without credible and strong proof.

A Division Bench comprising Justice Sanjeev Kumar and Justice Sanjay Parihar dismissed the State's appeal against the 2013 judgment of the Sessions Judge, Reasi, which had acquitted Abdul Latif and his brother Ghulam Nabi of charges under Sections 364, 302, 201, and 34 RPC.

The case pertained to the disappearance and alleged killing of Abdul Hameed, a

Hizbul Mujahideen, in September 2002. Police claimed that during interrogation in another FIR, accused Abdul Latif confessed to killing Hameed and concealing his body in a forest. Acting on this disclosure, a skeleton and clothes were recovered in 2006.

However, the trial court had acquitted the accused in December 2013, citing contradictions in witness testimonies, the inadmissibility of confessions made in police custody, and lack of forensic evidence such as DNA pro-

The High Court endorsed the trial court's findings, observing that the prosecution case was riddled with inconsistencies. It noted that several alleged eyewitanother, with some even suggesting that Hameed had voluntarily accompanied

The Bench further ruled that a police custody confession was inadmissible under Section 25 of the Evidence Act, and the recovery evidence of skeleton and clothes was doubtful. The absence of DNA verification further weakened the case.

Dismissing the State's appeal, the Court concluded: "The prosecution has miserably failed to prove the charge beyond reasonable doubt. The presumption of fortified by innocence acquittal cannot be shaken without strong and cogent proof."

The appeal was accordingly dismissed, leaving the 2013 acquittal intact.

Several Senior Assistants have been promoted as Head Assistants. Ajaz Hussain will now serve as Head Assistant (Nazir) in the PDJ Court, Kargil; Nissar Ali has been posted as Head Assistant (Reader) in the Special Mobile Magistrate Court, Kargil; Dechan Lamo takes charge as Head Assistant (Accountant) in the PDJ Court, Leh; while Altaf Hussain and Kunzes Dolma assume duties in Kargil and Leh respectively. ### Court seeks SSP report on judicial clerk's illegal detention

JAMMU: In a case that has cast a shadow on police conduct, the Court of Sub-Judge/Special Railway Magistrate, Jammu, Rajeev Kumar Tadyal, has directed the Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP), Jammu to submit a detailed report on the alleged thrashing, abuse, and wrongful confinement of a judicial clerk by Channi Himmat police officials.

The Court issued notice to Sub-Inspector Mohd Asif, Duty Munshi Shakeel, SgCT Sanjeev Kumar, SPO Satish Kumar, and SPO Rashpal Kumar, all posted at Police Station Channi Himmat, ordering them to appear in person on the next date of hearing, September 25, 2025.

The complaint was filed by Arif Ahmed, a Judicial Clerk posted at Munsiff Court (JMIC) Basohli, Kathua. He alleged that on August 17, 2025, around 1:30 am, while taking his ailing friend to JK Medicity Hospital, his car was stopped near Jamia Masjid Malik Market, ahead of Wave Mall. Police personnel allegedly banged on his vehicle, dragged him out by the collar, assaulted him with fists and kicks, and hurled filthy abuses. Despite disclosing his identity as a judicial clerk, Ahmed claimed he was forcibly taken to Police Station Channi Himmat, where he was wrongfully confined from 2:00 am to 12:30 pm without informing his family. His counsel, Advocate M. Zulkarnain Chowdhary, assisted by Advocates Yassar Iqbal and Nadeem Ahmed Choudhary, told the Court that the police also demanded money for his release and, upon refusal, fabricated a case under Sections 39/128 BNSS, producing him before the Executive Magistrate (Tehsildar Bahu), who later granted him bail. The counsel stressed that the police actions violated the Supreme Court's binding guidelines in D.K. Basu v. State of West Bengal (1997) and Arnesh Kumar v. State of Bihar (2014) on arrest and detention safeguards.

Taking note of the allegations and arguments, the Court directed the SSP Jammu to file a comprehensive report detailing the facts and circumstances of the incident.

The matter will be taken up again on September 25, 2025.

quashed three government orders of 2024 and ordered their appointment, the High Court clarified that under Rule 64 of the PSC (Business and Procedure) Rules, 2021, such select lists operate only for a year and must be reviewed annually.

The Court observed that though 120 candidates were empanelled against 105 vacancies in December 2022 and an additional 30 kept in reserve, the validity of the panel expired on November 30, 2023. Sixteen of the reserve candidates were accommodated before expiry, but others, including the respondents, could not be adjusted for want of vacancies. Upholding Government

Order No.297-JK(HE) of 2024, the Bench directed the Higher Education Department to strictly folseniority norms Incharge appointing Principals and restrict delegation of Drawing and Disbursing Officer (DDO) powers to such officers only. (JNF)

# HC quashes PSA detention, orders immediate release

JAMMU Jammu Kashmir and Ladakh at Jammu on Wednesday quashed the preventive detention of Bhupinder Kumar alias Pappu, a resident of Talab Tillo, Jammu, who had been held under the Public Safety Act (PSA), and ordered his immediate release from Central Jail, Jammu

Justice Α. Chowdhary, while pronouncing the judgment, criticized the District Magistrate, Kathua, for passing the detention order "mechanieally, without application of mind" and for trampling constitutional safeguards guaranteed to the detenue

The Court held that Kumar was not properly informed of his right to a representation against the detention order, nor was any time frame specified. It further found that the entire material forming the basis of detention had not been supplied or explained to him in a language he understood, thereby violating Article 22(5) of the Constitution.

Appearing for the peti-

tioner, Advocate Jagpaul Singh argued that the detention was arbitrary and based on old FIRs already considered in a previous PSA order, which the same Court had quashed in April 2024. On  $_{
m other}$ hand. Advocate Government Suneel Malhotra defended the detention, citing Kumar's alleged involvement in bovine smuggling

Rejecting the government's contention, Justice Chowdhary observed that preventive detention under the PSA cannot be invoked "on the drop of a hat" and must be reserved only for exceptionally grave cases involving threats to public order or security. national 'Personal liberty is the most cherished freedom, and the State cannot

resort to preventive detention as a substitute for regular prosecution," the Court remarked. Accordingly, detention order No PSA/137 dated

January 16, 2025, issued the Magistrate, Kathua, was set aside, and the Court directed that Bhupinder Kumar be released forthwith, if not required in any other case.

#### Ministry of Rural Development, Department of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Ministry of Jal Shakti and Ministry of Finance, will visit the affected areas over the next four days. During the meeting, a detailed PowerPoint presentation was given, explaining the scale of damages to private property, public infrastructure and loss of of lives. The Div Com apprised the members of the central team about the affected areas and extent of damages caused to the essential infrastructure including roads, power supply and water supply schemes. He also briefed the meeting about the efforts being made on war footing to save precious lives with the assistance and support of Security forces, emergency responders, NDRF, UTDRF, Police, Army, CAPFs. The meeting also discussed the challenging situation arisen due to incessant rains. Threadbare discussion was held on damage to roads, power infrastructure, water supply and the efforts being made to restore the same. Over the next four days, the inter-ministerial team will conduct detailed on ground visits to the affected areas to assess the actual scale of losses and damages in the districts of Jammu divi-

sion. It shall then submit a detailed report to the Government of
