JAMMU: Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Jammu & Kashmir President and former minister Sat Sharma (CA) interacted with the residents of various panchayats in Marh Assembly Constituency, listening to their concerns and assuring them that the party stands firmly by their side in this hour of crisis.

MLA Surinder Bhagat, District Prabhari Rajinder Singh Chib, senior leader Adv. Abhinav Sharma, besides district team members, Mandal Presidents, Sarpanches, Panches, and representatives of eleven severely affected panchay-
